FAIR trade chocolate and banana cookies are among the offerings in a recipe book compiled by students at Teesside High School.

Australian crunchie, spicy Indonesian salmon, and pizza-style chicken also feature in *Success on a Plate*, which is on sale for £3.

While many schools have abandoned cookery lessons, they are still taught to girls in years seven to nine, with many going on to study it at GCSE and A-level.

Many of the recipes are from the food and nutrition course while others have been supplied by enthusiastic cooks among the junior and senior pupils and staff.

Sue Jackson, head of food and nutrition, said the cookery classes gave lifelong skills

to both boys and girls.

She said: "Edition one of the recipe book is selling like the proverbial hot cakes and we have invited staff and pupils to submit further recipes for a future edition."

Success on a Plate is available from the school in Eaglescliffe. Proceeds will be split between the school's international links programme and equipment for the food and nutrition department.
