DISTRICT ATHLETICS CHAMPIONS!

What a day at the District Schools Athletics Competition; where 12 schools from across Stockton arrived at Middlesbrough Sports Village to compete across a range of track and field events on Monday.

Firstly, our Preliminary Girls (Year 7) Tinashe, Flo, Betsy, Amelie and Evie were unbelievable. Out of 8 events, they won five and finished second in a further two.

Tinashe won the 200m and long jump comfortably and Amelie smashed her PB to cross the line well ahead in the 800m (2 mins 47 seconds). The Preliminary Boys, a team of just four, Archer, Jacob, Gideon and Oliver, worked incredibly hard to cover all of the events and gained points across the board.

The Junior teams were made up of pupils from Years 8 and 9. The boys, captained by Kyle, had a number of great performances. Kyle led by example, winning the 800m and placing 2nd in the 1500m. Spencer won both the shot and discus, with the others collecting valuable points, too.

The Junior girls, captained by Annabel and Martha, finished in the top three in an impressive 10 out of 11 events. There were great performances from Annabel, 2nd in the 1500m and 1st in the high jump, and Tendai, not to be outdone by her sister, who won the shot put round with a superb throw of 8m 40.

Our Intermediate competitors (Year 10 and 11) worked hard and contributed to the overall totals, which were now mounting in our favour. Luca won the 100m with ease, Yasmin held on to win the 800m with a new PB and Matthew and Joel won both discus and high jump respectively.



Each event is point scoring, with 6 points for 1st down to 1 point for 6th. The results were as follows for THS:

Did You Know?

The government extended its free childcare to eligible 2 year olds from April 2024, which means for working parents you can now receive 15 hours funding for your son or daughter in Nursery from the start of the term they turn three. For example, if your child turns three in November, they can join our Nursery from September and funding will apply throughout. Please note, for this first term you are required to provide a funding code from gov.uk

Great North Museum

Last week, children in Upper Prep took their IPC learning up to Newcastle to visit the Great North Museum (formerly the Hancock Museum).

One of the activities that was completed was a visit to the museum's planetarium to watch the *Earth to the Universe* show. This gave the children a huge amount of information ranging from the importance of telescope advancements to information about each of the planets, stars and nebulae. It was hard not to duck as the huge asteroids were coming straight towards us!

The children then took part in a science workshop, led by one of the museum staff. This workshop was entitled *Our Place in Space*. The children were able to consider the Earth's position in the solar system, recapping their classroom learning about the 'Goldilocks zone' as well as learning how the moon's impact on the tides can play an important role to life on Earth. The children were then able to hold some of the museum's



exhibits to take a closer look.

This trip was perfectly timed for our IPC topic *Space Scientists* as the museum are currently hosting a *Space Investigators* exhibition which was our first stop after lunch. This exhibition showcased many items linked to the history of space and space developments over time.

Once we had completed all of the space themed activities, the children had the opportunity to explore the rest of the galleries. They enjoyed taking part in a scavenger hunt which allowed them to take a closer look at some of the exhibits.
































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
