

Tendai approaches all her sporting commitments with humility, dedication and an exceptional level of sportsmanship. She is always a pleasure to teach and a role model to her peers.






## Senior Sportsman - Kyle




## Year 7 Trip to Dearne Valley

Further up in the Senior School, our older students spent the morning exploring a range of topics including what life would be like as a Sixth Form pupil, knife crime (Cleveland Police), sexual harassment (Brook) and recognising relationship abuse (Harbour). Their afternoon was fun and challenging in a STEM session which saw them compete to solve

problems creatively as teams.

Finally Year 12 heard from Brook on healthy relationships once heading off to university and the 'bystander effect'. They practiced their cooking on budget skills with Mrs Howard and met with York St John University to discuss preparations for higher education. The session delivered by Cleveland Fire Brigade on driver safety was eye opening and super important. Their afternoon was very productive as they then began the process of logging into UCAS and starting the application process for the first time.

The learning with our partner agencies is incredibly impactful for our students and we are extremely grateful for their support each year.
